March Feature Vehicle

The Genesis GV70

New member Doug Thomas had his white 2021 Genesis GV70 in the garage this month. This beautiful vehicle runs a 2.5 litre, 4-cylinder turbo engine that achieves 0-100 kph in six seconds. It is mated to an 8-speed auto gearbox that delivers power to the rear wheels.



Doug explained that the brand was the high-end arm of Hyundai (much like Toyota and Lexus). He has owned the \$70k car for 12 months and bought it after seeing a display in a shopping centre and waiting 10 months for delivery.

He said the car was heavily computerised, with many driving functions controlled or assisted by the CPU. This includes a sophisticated 'self-drive' program that follows the road, distance, lane departure and cruise controls. It weighed 1.9 tonnes and was heavily soundproofed.

The car was designed by an ex-Bentley designer and Doug said that front was Bentley, the back end took after Porsche styling and the interior was Lamborghini.

The Cars Guide website says the Genesis is the brand's mid-sized SUV. The luxury five seater is a more affordable but still well-appointed alternative to the likes of BMW's X3 and Mercedes-Benz's GLC. A direct rival would be the Lexus NX. The line-up currently starts at \$70,500 for the GV70 2.5T and ranges through to \$126,475 for the range-topping GV70 Electrified Performance LUX.

It describes the GV70's interior as "downright plush". The dashboard features a 14.5-inch multimedia touchscreen that is also operated by a rotary dial that has crystal-looking embellishments. The 12.3-inch 3D digital instrument panel appears like a hologram without the image Instability. It has built-in satellite navigation. There is customisable ambient lighting.

The car is rated to tow 2200 kg with trailer brakes and fuel consumption is rated at just under 10 litres/100 kms (petrol). - Ed.

March Guest Speaker

Cottage by the Sea - Tony Featherston

Our March guest speaker, Tony Featherston, told us He said that the Cottage was a values-driven about the work of Cottage by the Sea in Oueenscliff.

Tony currently works part time for Cottage by the Sea, assisting with gifts in wills (beguests), group presentations and Cottage tours. He was the CEO Our Club is exploring the opportunity for a visit to from 2001 through to June 2019 and has been with the Cottage in future. the organisation for 24 years.

Cottage by the Sea is a not-for-profit, independent children's charity and receives no government funding. Established in 1890, its mission is to enhance the lives of more children by providing inspiration, fun and opportunity within a seaside environment.

Its diverse programs involve short-stay-camps that focus on adventures in nature. Participants are provided with opportunities to build positive relationships with peers and adult role models, which helps them learn and grow when they return to their schools and communities. It also offers respite holidays for families in a secondary facility, Riptide Cottage.

Throughout its long history, the Cottage has provided short term care in a holiday environment for children in need. Over time, those attending have included convalescing children, children affected by war, fire, flood, or those disadvantaged in key life areas.

In 2022-2023 the Cottage catered for 1,600 people, including 947 Take a Break participants, 192 Reef program participants and 122 in the Mentor program.

Take a Break provides one-off, one week holidays for 6-12 year old children in need. The Reef program is for those aged 11-14 and aims to assist in transitioning from primary to secondary school. The Mentor program caters for Reef program graduates, aged 13-18. It focusses on personal development and participants attend five or six programs per year over five years. It helps develop the skills that enable young people to contribute to their communities, schools, homes and the Cottage

Over the years the Cottage has attracted notable people as ambassadors, including Jimmy Bartel, Curtis Stone, Rod Laver, Joel Selwood and Patrick Dangerfield. Cathy Freeman and Frank Costa have been Patrons of the charity and this role is now held by Rebecca Maddern.

Tony said there was a growing need for what Cottage by the Sea does and independent impact studies have shown that Cottage programs leave a lasting impact on children, from increasing their confidence and self-belief to enhancing their sense of belonging.



Napier New Zealand - Art Deco Festival Feb 2024

On our recent trip to New Zealand we found ourselves transported back to the 1920/30s. In 1931, Napier and the Hawke's Bay region was devastated by an earthquake. The town of Napier was rebuilt in the art deco style of architecture.





It was a surprising delight as we happened to be in Napier for their annual Art Deco Festival. This was the first time the festival had been held in full since 2020, after the 2021 and 2022 events were hit by Covid and the 2023 festival had to be cancelled due to the devastating impacts of Cyclone Gabrielle.



Hundreds of vintage cars were on display over two days, coming from all over New Zealand.

The whole town dressed in the style or the era. There were Gatsby style picnics, singing, full dress 30's dancing, jazz, cars with 30's picnic tables, record players etc and even a soapbox derby for the kids, yes we felt as though we had been transported back in time, but time hadn't changed. Absolutely fabulous!

There were multi vintage tiger moth and mustang plane flyovers all day. The classic car were absolutely stunning and nearly all in concourse condition. The townsfolk were generous, warm and humble.
