



He married Shirley and has two children. Sadly Shirley passed away in 2000.

His first job was at Rochester Bendigo Motor Co. in spare parts, instead of as a mechanic. This was when the first Holden came out. He went on to get an apprenticeship.

His father died when he was about two and his mother moved the family to Geelong in about 1956.

He went on to work at Heaths Motors as a mechanic, then on to the RACV for 33 years.

Max's first car was a Morris Oxford which he purchased with three friends, for 30 pounds.

The cars he should have never sold was a 1939 Ford V8 convertible which he bought for 330 pounds and sold for 168 pounds. Oops. Also a 1942 BSA and side car.

He has had a Consul, Holden and an ED Falcon.

He now owns a 1969 XW Falcon V8 which he acquired when he got a call to Fords 50 years ago as an RACV driver. He asked the owner if he wanted to sell it and then waited. Who says good things don't come to those who wait. His daily drive is a Mazda and he also owns a Dodge 1951 Kingsway, a Norton Motor bike and a Honda Postie scooter.

Max's dream car is an early Mercedes convertible.

Max joined the club when it was in the Nissan huts in North Geelong and attended for two meetings, then started again at the Showgrounds.

He has attended numerous Sunday Runs and the Bay to Birdwood and also Tasmania. He loves Tinker Days and just being a part of the club.

He enjoys the friendship and has met some great people. He also enjoys Probus and is a Wednesday Warrior at the Showgrounds which led to him being made a Life Member of RGAPS.

He also became a life member of our club in 2010. He has been on the Swap committee since 1998, assistant editor and caretaker of our rooms since 2001.

He has collected the mail since 2000 and was made Clubman of the Year in 2003. He received the Eric Baker Award in 2009 and was on the Committee 2001 to 2007.

His partner during all this time is Jeanette.

The last thing Max said to me was the Club has been his life since he retired and he has enjoyed every bit of this great interest.



And a reminder that memberships are due by 31 March, so if you haven't paid already, time is running out! Non-financial members cannot legally operate their red plate vehicles either.









JANUARY TECH NIGHT "Brakes"

Brake drums can have leading and trailing brake shoes. This makes a difference in braking when travelling forward or reverse. It also makes a difference with the park brake. The rear brake drum has a leading and trailing shoe for an effective park brake.






Packard tried brakes with three shoes but it did not have any great advantage and was discontinued.

Spanning a Continent (taken from the Reader's Digest, April 1954)

A young lady wrote: "This grand road appears at a distance like an immense avenue of foliage and verdure. A charming freshness and an agreeable shade always pervades this continuous bower, the silence of which is interrupted by the singing and chirupping of the richly plumed parakeets and other birds which inhabit it ..."

The year was 1802 and the road she was describing was the 15 mile long Parramatta Road, built in 1794 from Sydney to Parramatta, and, apart from the roads within the settlements, Australia's first real road – "almost wide enough everywhere for three carriages to pass abreast".

Today, 151 years later, the Parramatta Road has a carriageway 60 feet wide and carries the heaviest traffic of any road in New South Wales.


Despite its vastness (the distance from Sydney to Perth is far greater than from London to Moscow") and its relatively small population, Australia's roads today stretch 510,514 miles throughout a total area of 2,974,581 square miles. Excluding tractors and trailers, these roads of ours carry 1,748,407 motor vehicles

Here are some figures which will be of interest:



New South Wales has a total of 127,337 miles of roads; Victoria 104,648: Queensland 134,858: South Australia 82,112; Western Australia 76,708; Tasmania 12,910; Australian Capital Territory and Northern Territory 1,941.

Responsibility for road construction and maintenance is borne by a Board, Commission or State Department in each of the States. These bodies plan road systems, provide financial and technical assistance to local government bodies or themselves undertake the building and maintenance of roads.



In general there are three types of roads and road surfaces: highways (concrete and bitumen), main roads (gravel, with bitumen where warranted), and secondary roads (natural earth).

An update: in 2022 Australia's total estimated paved road length was 427,000 kms. An estimated 254 billion vehicle kilometres were travelled on Australia's roads in 2022-23.
