Minutes of the General Meeting held Thursday 12th January 2023 at the clubrooms with 72 members and three visitors in attendance, and apologies from 14 members being recorded.

President Neil Rutherford opened the meeting at 8pm. His introductory comments included recognition of clubroom's preparation for meetings by Phil Podbury and Lloyd Healey's attention to the meeting room temperature and weekly bin routine. Visitors were Michael Cannon, and for the third time Brett and Riley Banner.

New club members, Tony and Liz Farrugia plus Gordon McDonald were welcomed to the club.

Minutes:

The motion of *Allan Weeks*, 2nd *David Grant*, for acceptance of the minutes of the Dec.8, 2022 meeting gained the meeting's support. No business arising.

Correspondence:

Outwards – Letters to T & L Farrugia and G. McDonald advising of the club's acceptance of their membership applications and that achievement of membership was conditional upon payment of the annual subscription.

Letter to Kelvin Maude enclosing membership application forms.

Inwards – Mooroopna Kiwanis re invitation to bring heritage vehicles to Ferrari Park at 10.30am January 25 for Australia Day Celebrations.

GV Hospice thanking the club for the \$1505 donation arising from our November anniversary.

Shepparton City Council indicating \$145 was payable for the registration of the food premises at our clubroom.

Correspondence was accepted following the motion moved by *B.Croke*, 2nd *V.Baker*.

REPORTS:**Treasurer's Report**

Peter Vibert tabled a three page report of transactions for the period Dec.8 to Jan.10 indicating expenses of \$1394.81, with \$1037.57 of this being Journal costs. A one page report indicated account balances. *P.Vibert* moved, *M.Croke* seconded the motion which achieved acceptance of the Treasurer's report.

Events s/c

Leigh Johnston directed members to the two Journal pages describing 15 forthcoming events. There were two important additions to the listing.

- "Red Plate Day" on Sunday Feb.12 at John and Jenny Grieve's place. This is the annual opportunity to have our vehicles checked over at no cost. See next month's Journal for further details.

- "Kyabram/Tongala Wednesday run February 22. This will include Kyabram Fauna Park (and café) then lunch at the Tongala Hotel.

Members interested in the Swan Hill "Mallee Gold Rally" on May 5-8 or the Mildura "Vineland Rally" on April 7-10 can obtain entry forms.

AOMC & Federation

Our delegates to each organisation noted there had not been a recent meeting.

Facilities s/c

Greg Sutherland mentioned that succulents had been planted and that the fencing at the park entry was to be fixed with concrete footings.

Social s/c

Col Grace noted gatherings listed in the Journal.

GUEST SPEAKERS:

A discussion covering the results of the late 2022 Club Survey was led by Robin Fletcher and Barry Croke. With 45 survey responses a reasonable degree of accuracy could be attributed to the collated findings. Findings included information about four main areas.

- Members
- Members' vehicles; type, operation costings, distance travelled.
- Club activities; opinions on current and possible future activities.
- Members' views on heritage vehicles in a world with low emission expectations.

Discussion seemed to reinforce the survey findings in that members appreciated the current activities and that they regarded some possible additional activities as important future inclusions in our annual program.

The implications of a 'low carbon' economy on the heritage vehicle movement need to be monitored by our club, AOMC and the Federation.

Survey respondents also expressed the desirability of our organisation being adequately briefed and able to contribute to discussions to show that these vehicles now had minimal overall impact on global warming but constituted an extremely valuable museum related to design and engineering for the wider community.

Postscript : Committee discussion (January 26) on this presentation resolved it was an excellent account about our Club and should be available to all members. The four survey areas will be reported in the successive editions of the club Journal.

An additional related paper "Background notes about greenhouse gas emissions" has been prepared by Barry Croke primarily as further information for members with a particular interest in the topic. It attempts to put heritage motoring into perspective with the wider energy world. It was agreed that this paper be made available to our State heritage motoring groups (AOMC and Federation). GVMVDC members wishing to receive a copy can do so at monthly general meetings.

GENERAL BUSINESS:

President Neil mentioned the National Motor Heritage Day. It is being organised by AOMC for May 21, 2023, with GVMVDC intending to organise a local vehicle display. There was indication of support from the meeting with further details to appear in later Journals.

Buy, Swap & Sell

Col Grace indicated that in the interests of creating garage space, three items are for sale. An MGB Mark 2 roadster, a single bed and a Holden utility canopy at negotiable prices.

Meeting closed at 9.05pm.

Next meeting scheduled for February 9, 2023.

- Our catering permit from Council has been paid.
- The future of the Swap Meet is dependent on getting insurance cover for the day. Brokers advise that insurers aren't keen to cover swaps larger than about 200 sites. This matter needs to be resolved soon for a decision to be made.

- The results of the club survey were discussed. They will be published in the Journal over a few issues.
- The clubrooms audio system was discussed. It was resolved to purchase two new microphones.
- National Motoring Heritage Day is on May 21. It is proposed to have a large display of our vehicles to expose our club to the general public. The AOMC provides financial assistance for such displays.
- This year's Red Plate Day will be on February 12 at John and Jenny's.
- The Federation is promoting their events on March 26 as fund-raisers for Peter Mac. Details to follow.

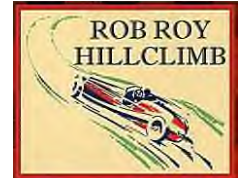

He was involved in the formation of the Murchison Nursing Home, Wybalena Retirement Village and the Community Centre and has held many positions in the Murchison Fire Brigade.

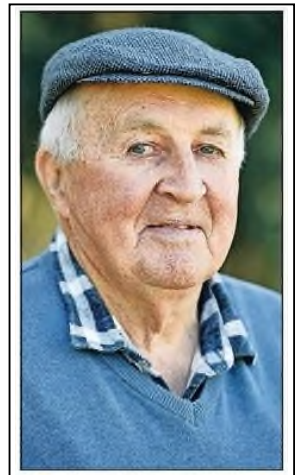
He is a member of the Murchison Lions Club,



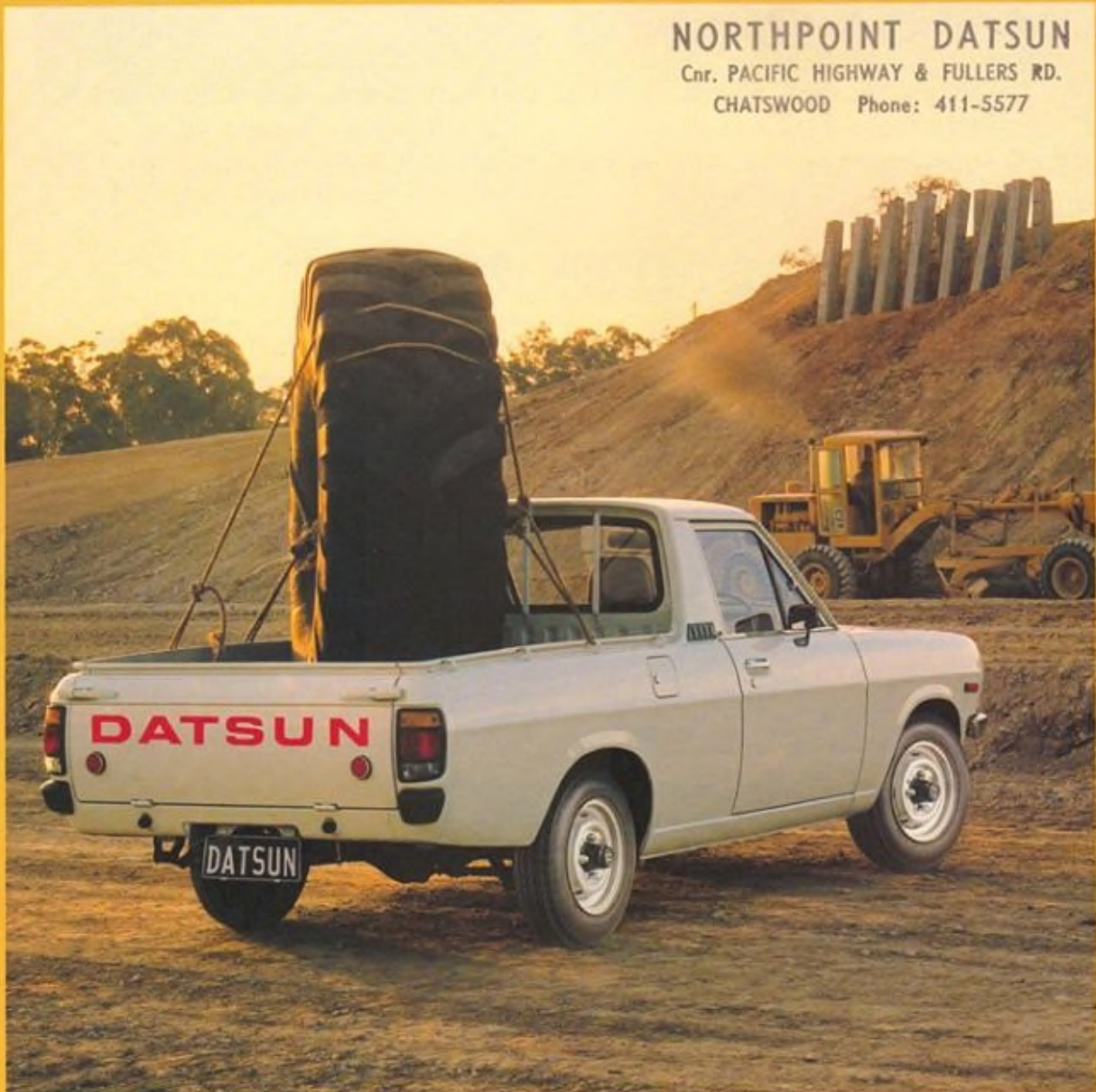

SHEPPARTON MOTOR RACES

UNDERA CIRCUIT

— 30th May, 1960 —

G.V.C.C.

The Goulburn Valley Car Club's inaugural Race Meeting on the new Undera Circuit was marred by only one thing — the weather — both before and during. What will prove to be Victoria's fastest country track was turned into a shambles after some five inches of rain in the preceding fortnight. Concerted effort by G.V.C.C. members and borrowed and hired equipment resurrected the surface to the extent where racing could be held — just! Almost all the 72 entries turned up, however, and so did over 5,000 spectators who braved the antarctic conditions and certainly got their money's worth.

First race was the under 1600 saloon scratch, won in easy style by Bob Brown in the very quick Hillman. Local boys Paul Griffiths and Bob Healey filled the placings with a gaggle of Majors and Peugeots behind.

Jacques Sapir in the Cooper Vincent had little trouble in the under 1000 c.c. racing car scratch, lapping very consistently. The over 1000 c.c. race car scratch was run over two heats and a final with Bill Sherwill's Holden Special narrowly defeating Barry Stilo in the Edelbrock Ford. Barry equalled the lap record of 1.20 in this race.

The Sports Car scratch proved to be a very interesting battle between Frank Coad (Vauxhall), Bryan Thomson (Monza) and Ray Gibbs (Cooper Climax). Frank held the lead, creating the lap record in the second lap with Gibbs staving off the Monza all the way. With only a hundred yards to the finish Frank went for an excursion into the pepper trees and let Gibbs take the honours with Thomson second and the very fast Buchanan Holden Coupe (G. Crothers) third. Ray Gibbs best lap of 1.20 again equalled the record.

The Grand Touring Scratch saw eleven potent starters on the grid. Doonan shot to the front hotly pursued by Don Lawrence and Des Peace all in Repco Holdens. Next time round Max McPherson in a Porsche-powered Volkswagen was pushing Lawrence for second and eventually succeeded in showing the Repco's how to circulate by putting up fastest lap at 1.29.

Event 9.—First heat of the District Drivers Handicap saw the largest field of the day with sixteen saloons on the track. John Spanbroek held his Holden in first slot till the end but

Alan Trevaskis in the Morris Major finished well through the packed field and was very close at the finish.

A lot of interest was robbed from the handicap races by virtue of the fact that the long straights had to be eliminated prior to the meeting due to flooding.

In the Race Car Handicap under 1000 c.c., newcomer Bruce Moncrieff in his BMS 1000 showed some startling bursts of speed and, although hampered by extremely direct steering, lapped at almost the same as Sapir's Cooper to hold first place. Jacques had an argument with the bales at the end of the straight and finished behind the tow truck.

Noticed Helen Lukey cheering the leader in the next event—the over 1600 saloon handicap. The leader was propelling his huge black Customline at an amazing pace on the tight, and by now, very rough circuit. Limit man, A. Misuraca, in his first competition drive, handled the big Ford well and kept Bob Brown's Hillman at bay till he got the flag.

Gordon Crothers featured in the next heat of the District Drivers Handicap and crept up through the field, chased frantically by the Stilo brothers. Bill Sherwill retired with a broken radiator and Jim Pearsall's Riley Special lost some plumbing in the second lap. Much to handicapper, Bruce Watt's delight, four cars crossed the line together with the rest of the field in the pit straight. Spot on job!

Bryan Thomson again showed his dirt track experience and came from scratch through a field of eleven to take the Sports Handicap. Glued to the Monza's fins was the white Cooper of Ray Gibbs in second spot. Both cars lapped in 1.21 and provided some spectacular racing as they wended their way through the traffic.

Only four cars appeared for the Racing Car Handicap over 1000 c.c. and the first misfortune of the day occurred when D. Stevens (VADC) in the Frazer Nash rolled on Hodge Motors Hairpin after a brief clash with Stilo's Edelbrock. Stevens was pinned under the overturned car for a few seconds but came out virtually unscathed.

Sydney competitor John Bissett turned up the wick in the Buckle and was never headed in the first heat of the feature race and succeeded in lapping at 1.22. Thomson (Monza) re-

tired in the third lap with the float level in that monstrous carb stuck at maximum.

The Buckle again featured in the Grand Touring Handicap holding off a determined effort by Austin Lancer punter Alan Edney and the stove-hot Volkswagen of McPherson. Both John Bissett and McPherson put in laps of 1.27.

At this stage of the proceedings the racing was interrupted for a few minutes while Len Lukey did the honours and opened the circuit. Len said that he was amazed that so many people came out on such a freezing day and he could see the potential in the future when the full one and three quarter mile circuit was used and the surface sealed. It was certainly a great honour for the G.V.C.C. to have Len there and his presence added stimulus to the already high enthusiasm.

Back to the racing and the highlight of the day — the £100 Feature Race. Sherwill returning to the fray with his cooling system somewhat altered, led for the first three laps with Barry Stilo and Bryan Thomson repeating their Tarrawingee episode behind him. What could have been a serious accident turned out alright when John Bissett converted the Buckle into a convertible by overturning amongst the hay bales at the end of the straight. He was narrowly missed by Graeme North in his Healey and only prompt action by the officials saved the day. On the fourth lap Sherwill slowed noticeably after negotiating the esses and Stilo took the lead. Bryan Thomson, however, seemed to find a few extra horses and in a thrilling 1.20 lap passed the Ford on the straight and kept the Monza in front for the remaining four laps. Sherwill was forced to retire on the fifth lap and as they crossed the line the order was Thomson, Stilo, Gibbs, Sapir, and North.

Sapir took the flag in the Visiting Drivers Handicap with Alan Heasman in the TD and Alan Edney's Lancer taking the other places. Reg Smith, with Bonedome, brought his Volkswagen home first in the Consolation, J. Kupsch (Peugeot) and M. Ford (Morris Major) being second and third. Barry Stilo rounded off a very successful day with the Butchers Picnic.

With over 70% of the drivers collecting prize money and trophies, everyone voted the day a success.

The bracket is real timber, not chipboard and is painted sign writing, double sided, so must be reasonably old. Does anyone know the history of this sign as I would love to know something about it.

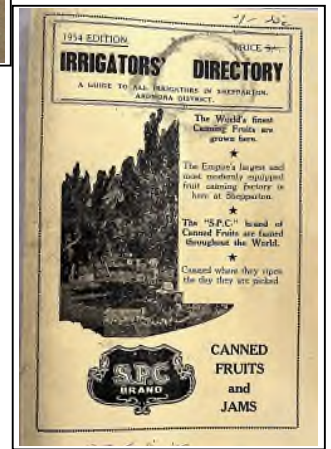

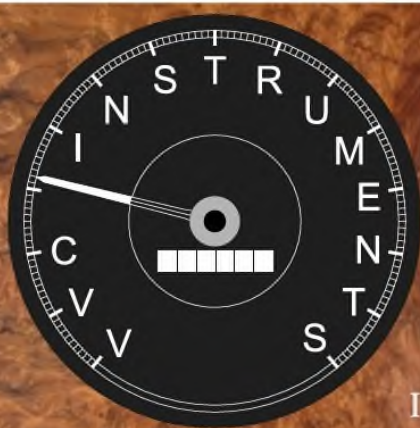
