

Keith has pointed out that some clubs like the Chrysler Club also have listings for people with vehicles, so as to allow others looking for advice to directly call someone with the same model.

This will be discussed at the next General Meeting to see if this might be something club members wish to do.

If this were to proceed, then in May the Membership Renewal form will have a box with the option to add your vehicles to such a list or withhold the information.

As secretary I often have calls about the club. A gentleman in the district asked during the Covid lockdown about joining the club as he has a Mighty Boy. I advised him we have 2 club members with this vehicle, and one regularly attends meetings. Sadly, he never came along to a meeting.

Prior to 1959 the Victoria Police used Dodge vans called 'Black Marias' as divisional vans, and then they ordered Ford Mainline utilities fitted with a canopy, as well as 16 Zephyr utilities, also with a canopy fitted.

Ray spotted this rather worn-out, but still almost complete, Mark 2 Ford Zephyr divisional van behind a shop in Dunolly in 2008, where it rested after having been used as a farm hack. Ray asked if it was for sale, and the owner said 'No', as he intended to restore it himself. Ray left his phone number and was surprised to receive a call some months later wanting to know if he was still interested. Price was discussed, an agreement reached, and Ray took the van home and set about its restoration.

The body was given a thorough going-over, being sand-blasted, all rust cut out and new metal welded in, and new rear doors fabricated to fit the opening. The original doors were not with the vehicle, so the doors had to be fabricated without a pattern and made to fit. New seats for the rear compartment were also fabricated, and the whole vehicle was repainted in the original Police colour. (If my memory is correct, I think it was called Powder Blue -ed). The mechanicals were also thoroughly overhauled, by his nephew Darren Anderson, and the upholstery was renewed, and the interior brought back to look like new.

The van hit the road again in 2013 and Ray believes that this is the only remaining Zephyr Divvy van in Victoria. As a member of the Police Historical Society, Ray has been allowed to fit both an operating siren and blue light to the vehicle. However, these are not allowed to be used whilst the vehicle is in motion, and an isolating switch has been fitted under the bonnet to comply with regulations.

If you think you have seen this van before, the chances are that you have, as it regularly appeared in the ABC television series '*Dr Blake Mysteries*' which aired from 2013. Also appearing in this show was a 1954 Mark 1 Zephyr sedan in Police form and when the TV show finished, Ray was offered the chance to buy this car too, and of course he did. But he has since sold this car, (it is still locally owned), and has now purchased the first representation of the Mark 2 Zephyr sedan, - also a Police car. This can be identified by the circular park/turn lights at the front, and his Divvy van is the update model with the vertical park/turn lights, and a slightly redesigned grille.

Ray's van always draws a crowd whenever he displays it, and so too will his sedan, especially when they are displayed together.


